10.00am	On arrival have teas, coffees and soft drinks whilst taking in the wonderful views from the South Front Portico, wander around the classic cars and motorbikes, for the adventurous take a ride in the tethered hot air balloon or have a go on one of the traditional fun fair rides, check out the charity auction items, or register for one of the guided tours of the house and gardens.
11.00am	Robing for the formal part of the day - the Festival Forum.
11.30am	Festival Forum - Procession of the guests of honour; the Most Worshipful Pro Grand Master, Jonathan Spence, and the Headmaster, Dr. Anthony Wallersteiner. Welcome from the Worshipful Master of Stowe Lodge, brief speeches from the Pro Grand Master and the Chairman of the Public School Lodges' Council and the Headmaster will give a short talk on Stowe and its relationship to Freemasonry.
	Please note: Masons are expected to attend this part of the day and it is also open to non-Masons as well. The Headmaster, Dr. Anthony Wallersteiner, is a highly engaging and witty public speaker so this might be a highlight of the day.

12.15pm	Disrobe and, if desired, change into smart casual / garden party attire for the remainder of the day's activities.
12.45pm	A 'Big Picture' of all the attendees will be taken on the South Front steps.
1.00pm	The Headmaster's drinks reception, accompanied by Stoic and Old Stoic musicians. We will also have a parade of Stowe's huntsmen and their beagle pack.
1.30pm	A rolling three-course buffet lunch will be served in the State dining rooms, accompanied by wines and soft drinks.
